  - ▶ Reportedly only five thousand copies of the one Shahi stamps were handstamp '1335' in Farsi.
  - ▶ CV-\$500.00 mint
  - ▶ CV-\$350.00 used

WHAT IS THE BIG DEAL?

- ▶ Knowing my material I bid \$80.00usd.
    - ▶ Starting bid was \$70.00usd.
  - ▶ Seeing a post mark that appeared valid was the deciding factor in bidding on this Persian stamp.
    - ▶ Simple math makes my knowledge come out to 1/4<sup>th</sup> of catalogue value.
      - ▶ Not bad in my book.
